Personally I struggled to decide between 3 and 4 stars, and would have given this 3.5 if I could have. Disclaimer: I am a young earth creationist, and I was one before reading the book. The book did not change my opinion in any way. The book has several really strong points, which I will mention first: (this is not an all inclusive list) 1) It attempts to bring a case to the scientific table with out quoting scripture. While this in a sense sets Mr. Morris in a handicapped position, it is good to show that many of the creationist ideas are valid science. 2) It shows what the real debate is. This is the books strongest point, it exposes that the issue is not in the details, but in the philosophy. That is , if you believe in the secular naturalistic theories of origins, then everything you find you will force to fit in to that model. The same is true if you follow the Young Earth Creationist philosophy. This is why gaggles of fossils all over the world can be seen as proof of Noah's flood, or as evidence of evolution. The fact (which is that there are fossils everywhere) is neutral to the debate, its the interpretation of the fact that puts it in either, or in this case both camps. 3) It has several good points about prediction verse explanation. If a model can PREDICT what we see in nature, vs having to come up with an explanation of how to make what we observe in nature to fit it, it is much more likely to be the correct model. 4) It has several good strong points that show massive flaws in the naturalistic explanation of origins that are still valid today. Some weak points... 1) The entire chapter on probability and chance should be removed. If there is any chance at all, no matter how small, then it could happen. Therefore, any argument based on chance does not rule out, but instead rules in the possibility of naturalistic origins. 2) The section on astronomy is based on science from the early 1970's (which is huge disagreement with today) and should be ignored unless some one at ICR wants to update it. This is understandable given the age of the book, but since it was apparently reprinted in 2000, it would have been good for ICR to update it. 3) There are several places where Mr. Morris waves his hand over problems and issues that require a real answer. 4) He never goes in to any real depth with his arguments, and is not careful with his definitions. In conclusion, if you are only interested in an introduction to the the field of research that supports a young earth, and creation by an omnipotent creator, then this is a good EASY read. However there are many books out there that are up to date with current knowledge that go much deeper.
